

Did you know that The Robertson Trust offer a variety of both revenue and capital funding to charitable organisations and constituted community groups that help people and communities in Scotland who are living with poverty and trauma.

They offer a range of grants starting from 'Wee Grants' of up to £2,000 for constituted community groups and charities with an annual income of less than £25,000 right up to larger revenue funding of between £15,000 and £50,000 for up to five years- suitable for registered charities with an annual income of between £100,000 and £2 million.

FAMILY FUND

Take a Break Scotland grant scheme is now open!

Take a Break provides cash grants to carers of disabled children and young people, aged 0 to 20, who have complex additional support needs. The grant can be used to contribute towards things like day trips, a short break away, an additional carer, travel costs, clubs and activities.

The scheme aims to improve unpaid carer's quality of life, health and wellbeing by supporting them in accessing a break from the day-to-day routine of caring. It is funded by the Scottish Government and administered by Family Fund charity.


